#### **Fire Info**



- Location: Spread across south and central Québec
- Start time: Major outburst beginning on and around June 1, 2023

- Suspected cause: Mix of Lightning and Human causes
- Many continue to be out of control as of June 27, 2023.
- Most fires from this outburst classified as out or under control as of August 21, 2023


### **Contributing Conditions**


Started in a period of extreme fire danger due to:

- a long dry period
- Long lasting hot weather
- Mid Latitude cyclone and cold front creating lightning generating thunderstorms

Images showing extent of smoke spread: from Québec to Europe!








